## Minutes - March 2019 Meeting

On March 4, 2019 we had the pleasure of having Commander Ron Boneau of the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary come to our meeting. He discussed the role of the Auxiliary in east Tennessee waters and water safety issues. Ron's Division 12, one of several in Tennessee, includes five flotillas. These cover Tellico, Ft. Loudon, Norris, Watts Bar and the southern portion of South Holston Reservoirs. They are working to establish a new flotilla to cover Douglas and Cherokee. While part of the U.S. Coast Guard and therefore under the umbrella of Homeland Security, the Auxiliary is an all-volunteer group. They were established in 1939 and have some 24,500 members nationwide. They are not military or law enforcement. Rather, they are the public face of the Coast Guard and work closely with the Coast Guard and TWRA to promote water safety.

In 2018, Division 12 conducted 445 boat safety checks at 14 marinas. These checks were for proper boat registration; licensing for captains born after Jan. 1, 1989; proper personal floatation devices; fire extinguishers and other items. Some of the items he discussed included the need to have a rope attached to your throwable PFD so that it can be quickly retrieved if the target can't get to it; attaching a whistle to life vests so that help can be called; having PFDs out and available for quick access rather than having them stored in a boat locker; having your fire extinguisher mounted outside of a locker and away from the motor and gas tank so it can be used quickly; and the importance of leaving a float plan with someone who will know if you don't return when you should so that help can be directed to the area where you are boating. Safe boating classes are available from several sources including the BoatUS Foundation, TWRA and the Coast Guard. Completion of one of these classes may reduce your boat insurance premium.

In other business, the members decided to contribute \$500 each to 4-H clubs to assist needy children fully participate and to support TWRA's children's fishing day which will be held on Saturday, June 8 at Eagle Bend Fish Hatchery in Clinton. Members are encouraged to attend the fishing day and help teach youngsters how to fish.



### Creel and Size limits

#### CHEROKEE LAKE

#### Striped Bass or Hybrid Striped Bass:

2 per day in combination, 15 inch minimum length limit

#### **NORRIS LAKE**

#### **Striped Bass**

April 1–October 31: 2 per day, 15 inch minimum length limit

November 1-March 31:1 per day, 36 inch minimum length limit

#### WATTS BAR

#### **Striped Bass or Hybrid Striped Bass:**

April 1–October 31: 2 per day in combination

November 1–March 31: 2 per day in combination, only one may be a striped bass.

#### **Striped Bass:**

April 1–October 31:15 inch minimum length limit.

November 1-March 31:36 inch minimum length limit

#### **Hybrid Striped Bass:**

15 inch minimum length limit

#### **MELTON HILL**

#### **Striped Bass or Hybrid Striped Bass:**

2 per day in combination, including Clinch River upstream to Highway 61 bridge in Clinton. 15 inch minimum length limit

#### **Striped Bass:**

32–42 inch PLR; only one fish may be over 42 inches

# Outlook for current fishing spots

#### CHEROKEE LAKE

The baitfish seek out the warmer water, so look for the sun-warmed banks and into deeper water after a cool night. The gulls and herons will continue to show where the best bait locations are to be found. Top water breaks are common this time of year, so go prepared to cast into them. Large schools can often be found on the fish finders, making jigging a technique that works well. The premium locations are normally upstream of the German Creek area and into the extreme headwaters.

#### NORRIS LAKE

Looking for the active gulls or surface feeding fish may be the key to success in catching fish as the water starts to warm in the shallow, sunwarmed areas. Remember the creel and size limits on striped bass are 36-inch minimum with a one fish creel until April 1, 2017. The largest concentrations of striper will be on the upper half of the reservoir, often in the shallow, sun-warmed stained water.

#### WATTS BAR & MELTON HILL

The winter time striper bite was influenced much less by the warm water discharge at the steam plants than in some past years because of the mild winter with lots of hydroelectric power. The baitfish will start to show up in the shallow, sun-warmed flats with the gulls and herons helping to find the feeding stripers.


