President's Letter

Incorporation - The TSBA has officially incorporated as the Tennessee Striped Bass Association, Inc. The new nonprofit association was formed by the present officers who developed and approved a set of Bylaws for the club. Next, we worked with Attorney Rick Swanson of Morristown, who did all of the necessary paperwork to satisfy the State of Tennessee. The next step is for all of the remaining members to become part of the new corporation. To do this, you must sign and return the enclosed application along with your 2005 dues of \$20. Basically, you are agreeing to abide by and be bound by the Bylaws. If you have access to the Internet, you can read the Bylaws by going to our website "TNStripedBass.com" and clicking on the Bylaws link. lf you don't have Internet access, we will mail you a copy of the Bylaws if you request one. According to Rick Swanson, this is a very important step as it provides a liability shield for all of the members as long as we truly run the club as a nonprofit association according to the Bylaws. As I understand it, you will be responsible for your own actions; but the corporate shield will give you increased immunity for the actions of other members. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to call me at 865-471-1365; and I will do my best to get answers to your questions.

2005 Officers & Directors - At the October 18th meeting at Shoney's, we will nominate several Directors to fill out the Board of Directors which will consist of the present Officers and three or four more Directors. (Elections will take place at the November 15th meeting.) The initial terms of office for the Directors will be from one to four years. As the Directors' terms expire, the length of each term will be increased to four years. According to the Bylaws, the Directors will elect the Officers for the club. This is a departure from the past and we can discuss it at the meeting. The most important

item to be discussed will be who does the club want for both Officers and Directors for the next year. If you have any interest in helping run the TSBA, then please contact me in advance at rdleach1@msn.com or bring it up at the meeting. It is extremely important that we continually have new blood filtering into the organization. It really would be nice to have at least two candidates for each office so there would be a choice in determining who will lead the club.

November Tournament - On November 20, we are scheduling a TSBA tournament on Cherokee. While the details have not been finalized, I want it to be a "Get Acquainted" fishing outing. Basically, I would like for everyone to partner up with someone that they have never fished with before. Let's go outside of our normal circle of fishing buddies and team up with someone new. I would be willing to bet many of us will have a new friend at the end of the day. You can still have your favorite buddy along but let's also put someone new in your boat. As far as the tournament is concerned, I propose that we have a \$25 per boat entry fee with with a pay out as follows:

40% for the largest striper 40% for the largest hybrid 20% to the club's 2005 Kid's Weekend Fund

The prize money goes to everyone in the boat so it does not matter who catches the winning fish. This will be fun and the Kid's Weekend Fund needs the money. We will discuss this further at the October monthly meeting.

BEGINNER STRIPER FISHING 101

To keep from having to start over and over with equipment because you purchased what someone else wanted to sell, find out what the experienced fishermen are using in the river, tailrace, or reservoir you want to fish. Different equipment is sometimes needed for different systems. Questions can be answered by going on the internet, buying magazines, or joining striper clubs in your area. If you can find a guide that uses the water you want to fish, it is normally a good investment to have some questions answered. Most guides enjoy sharing the knowledge and experience they have - so be prepared to ask a lot of questions and take notes. Can I buy live bait? Can you show me how to use a cast net? What size mesh and net size is needed? Where can I catch bait? What size bait? All year? How can I keep it alive? What size tank? Where can I get one? What kind of chemicals do you put in it? How long can I keep bait lively? Ask your guide why he purchased that boat, gas motor, electric motor, and trailer. What would you change if you got a new one today? Do you use artificial lures? What size and color? Do you use downriggers or outriggers? What all kinds of rods and reels do you use? What about line size, hook size, and color? What kind of fish finder do you use? Do I need GPS and radar? The effort here is intended to educate you on questions for



your first purchase so your garage is not full of the wrong color, size, shape, length, weight, brand, and just didn't need it. By Ezell Cox

November Expectations

The lake turnover is complete and with no thermocline. Top water action is common, and catch and release is almost always successful. The water temperature is normally around the mid 50 degree F. range with cooler water in the shallow coves. Stripers often run up in the larger coves to feed on the abundant bait fish that are usually there. Sometimes as early as November the gulls start to show where to fish by diving on the shad that stripers cause to come to the surface when they feed. Tailrace fishing will begin to slow and the steam plants may start to attract the bait fish if the weather is cold enough and the steam plant discharge is warm.

Fishing Hot Spots



CHEROKEE LAKE: Good

Top water action is often good so keep something to cast handy. Stripers can migrate to any part of the lake with the temperature and oxygen comfortable everywhere so look for large concentrations of bait fish, gulls, or breaking fish. Normally, the best area to look is from Point #20 downstream to the dam.

NORRIS LAKE: Good

Remember to check the fishing regulations on Norris starting November 1 because it is your responsibility to stay legal on quantity and size harvested (1 fish@ 24 inches). Look around mid lake and in the large coves.

TAILRACE AND DOWNSTREAM: Good
