Ex-President's Letter

Farewell - As you may already know, I am no longer the President of the TSBA and this is my last President's letter. Overall, 2004 was a busy, fruitful year as several new projects were implemented and most were well received. Hopefully, these will be expanded as this is the way to keep the club moving forward. Here is a quick review of our 2004 highlights.

Cherokee Campout - This event was extremely well received, and I predict that it will become our most popular event in the future. Don't miss this year's event on beautiful Cherokee Lake.

Cumberland River - Another new event for 2004 was a trip to the Cumberland River in late spring. This event will definitely become bigger each year as this gives our members a real chance at catching a trophy Striper. In fact, I think the club should schedule two trips in 2005 - one in late May and another in August. The camaraderie was great on last year's trip.

Open Fishing - In 2004, we started an "Open Fishing" program where members would gather on a Saturday afternoon and go out fishing together. It started out slow but it was gaining momentum near the end of the year. It's a great opportunity to meet and get acquainted with your fellow striper fishermen.

Incorporation - Probably the most important thing we did in 2004 was to incorporate the club into a tax-exempt, nonprofit association. This was quite a project but it was something that really needed to be done.

Bumper Stickers - The club developed a new "Bumper Sticker" for distribution to it's members. These are now ready and they are being mailed out to members as they pay their 2005 dues and sign the form making them a member in the new **Tennessee Striped Bass Association, Inc.**

Norris Reservoir - We have been advised by the TWRA that our proposal to temporarily increase the wintertime minimun length on Norris has passed and will be in effect through 2008.

Kingston Tournament - The 2005 Kingston Striper tournament hosted by the TSBA will be held on Watts Bar on Saturday, February 19, 2005. Registration will be from 10:30 to 10:45 AM, and we will launch at 11:00 AM from the Kingston City Park. The entry fee will be \$10 and the pay out will be 100%. Please go to our website for further details and directions to the launch site. Also, please remember that the TWRA recommends that you do not eat any striped bass taken from these waters. Last year we had a total of 16 participants and everyone had a good time. The 2005 tourney should be even better.

Hickory Star - The Hickory Star Christmas Classic was held the first weekend in December as it has been for several years. A total of 42 fishermen participated which was down from last year primarily due to a scheduling conflict with the NSBA's tournament. Hopefully this can be avoided in the future.

Allan Franklin won the tournament with a total weight of 24 pounds -12 ounces which was only 10 ounces better than Brett Johnson's total of 24 pounds-2 ounces. Third place went to Wayne Smith while Jerry Cochrell captured fourth. A lot of stripers were caught, but none of them were big by historical standards for Norris Reservoir. The entry fee was \$50 per person, and the the payout for first through fourth place was 50%, 25%, 15% and 10%.

Winter at the Steamplants By Ezell Cox

The steamplants attract a lot of bait fish, game fish, and fishermen in that order as the winter gets colder. The fishing just gets better as the contrast gets greater in water temperature. The water temperature that is not affected by the steamplant may go into the low 40 degrees F. If the winter has a low water flow, a 20 degree F. contrast may extend upstream and downstream for a mile or two. Fishing is often good all the way to the edge of the warm water plume. When the stripers feed in the warm water, their metabolism stays high, and large bait may continue to work well (like skipjacks). If there is a large concentration of small bait fish, you may want to remember that stripers are very size and species selective (use what is there). The gulls will help you find fish, and chum will also help bring the fish to your location. If the wind is not blowing, the warm water radiates to make a very comfortable fishing trip. No cabin fever for me because I am going to the steamplant.

The following is included in your daily rate: guide, boat, gas, ice, balt, tackle, fishing instructions and a picture of your catch.

Please have: a valid North Carolina Fishing Llcense, appropriate clothing, food, drinks & camera. Each angler is allowed to keep four stripers over twenty inches in length. If you wish



to take fish home, bring a chest filled with ice. A fishing license can be purchased on line at www.ncwildlife.org, or in person at West Marine, Wal-Mart, Dick's Sporting Goods or local tackle shops.

Half day trips are approximately four hours, three-quarter days six hours and a full day trip is about eight hours. To maximize fishing time, we will meet at a landing near the area we plan to fish. The landing site varies with the season.

Customers residing on Lake Norman can choose to be picked up at their own dock.

February Expectations

Wintertime patterns are expected in all reservoirs as long as the temperature remains well below 50 degrees. Slow catch rates will be on the mid lake and downstream sections. Winter kill off of small bait fish may start to develop as soon as the water temperature drops. The stripers and gulls may occasionally work the surface together. Normally the best fishina is near the large concentration of small baitfish in the main channels, 20 to 40 feet deep. The next few months is when the records have been and will be broken. The steam plants are the premium places to fish until the water warms up in the spring. Skipjack have been the choice bait for most of the past records and trophies; however, the most abundant forage fish will catch the most fish even if they are Planer boards, balloons, smaller bait. sinkers, bottom fishing and artificials all work at the steam plants while the high concentrations of baitfish and all types of game fish are there.

Fishing Hot Spots



Cherokee Lake

Condition: Good **Location:** Spread out all over with a good number of fish near Hwy 25 Bridge. Fish are hitting top water baits. Birds are diving on the schools of shad driven up by the stripers. **Bait:** Live Shad and Top Water **Notes:** Fish are going back.

Norris Lake

Condition: Slow

Location: Stripers may be found farther upstream in the creeks. Use alewife and gizzard shad near the surface on drift lines or downriggers to 30 feet. Cast artificials into the breaking fish. **Notes:** Fish are going back and there is some top water action. Bait, as always, is impossible to catch. Bring bait with you.

Watts Bar Lake

Condition: Fair

Notes: Fish near the Kingston Steam Plant in the warmer water. Remember to keep your boat within the buoys where designated in the Fishing Regulations.

Melton Hill Lake

Condition: Fair

Location: Bull Run Steam plant or the Upper Clinch is the place to try with gizzard shad and cut-bait. Top water baits are definitely an option.
