# President's Letter


# Club Meetings:


# Mailing List:

# 2005 Tournament Trail

April 16th tournament - The second TSBA tournament of 2005 was held on Cherokee Lake. A total of 17 anglers launched from the Oak Grove boat ramp at first safe light. Everything went quite well except that the stripers weren't all that hungry. The top three finishers were: Bill Ballou - 17/03, Bill Cate - 07/03, and Bob Leach at 06/11 pounds. Both Bill Cate and I want to thank Ezell for releasing a striper just under 8 pounds that would have placed second. He assumed, as I did, that the weights for the top finishers would be well into the high teens based upon the fish that were being caught prior to the tournament. You never really know about striper fishing. Just a few days before the tournament, Rocky Hollow was red hot, but only one fish was caught there during our event. The results of this and previous TSBA tournaments prompted me to explore ways to improve the numbers of fish being caught during our outings. We have developed several ideas to pursue before the next event.

The overall leaders for the "TSBA Angler of the Year" award are as follows: Wes Adams - 25/11, Bill Ballou - 17/03, Mark Beggs - 14/02, Bobby Hall - 13/12, and Charlie Beggs - 12/03.

May 21 - The next TSBA tournament will be on Cherokee on May 21. By then, most stripers will have migrated farther downstream so we will probably be launching at the Grainger County Park, but we are going to officially announce the launch location and time closer to the event date in an attempt to select the location closest to where we think most members will be fishing. Also, we will probably make this an afternoon outing as this would overcome most of the concerns for those who do not live close to Cherokee. We sincerely would appreciate any input from you as we want to make these tournaments as good as we can so we can all have a good time with our buddies.

# **Fishing Hot Spots**



Cherokee Lake: Good

Point #1 at the dam upstream to Point #21 above the 25E bridge. Hybrids are more tolerant of the warm water and can often be caught in schools in shallow water. They can also be released normally without mortality. The humps in the middle of the lake near the dam usually become excellent.

Norris Lake: Fair

33 Bridge downstream to Point #19 on the Clinch side. Below Point #14 at Blue Springs downstream to Point #11 below Springs Dock on the Powell side. Look on the inside bends of the river and in front of the major coves with creek feeds.

# Below Fort Loudon & Melton Hill Dams: Good & Improving

Many of the stripers will go upstream to the discharge at the dams. Put your sinker and hook close to the bottom with plans to lose a few for the most catches. Pulling side planer boards down the banks can also catch fish for miles downstream.

There are certain times of the year when downriggers work better than live bait. Make sure to check the fishing regulations for use of umbrella rigs. In Tennessee, you may only use one single hook on the entire umbrella rig.

Allan Franklin attended the Aquatic Nuisance Species Task Force meeting in Nashville. The task force is forming now and asking our club to identify potential nuisances and bring information back. It is unlawful to possess blueback herring in the State of Tennessee. In order to be sure, only place gizzard shad or yellowtails in your bait tank. The next task force meeting will be in July.

The Norris Lake Advisory Committee meeting will be held at the Eagle Bend Fish Hatchery on May 10. Ezell Cox and Eric Rauch will be the official TSBA representatives at that meeting.

# **June Expectations**

The reservoir stripers have finished the spawn run and continue to move slowly downstream as the thermocline gets deeper. Top water action is in the early morning or not at all, but a good fish finder will start showing the schools of stripers that are deep enough not to shy away from the boat. The confluence of the major creeks and old river channel near mid lake are good target areas. The large, shallow flats that transition quickly to deep water are also excellent places for stripers to hold. The stripers normally feed aggressively after the spawn is complete. Catch and release starts to become questionable this month; however, in the tailrace and rivers below dams you will be able to release successfully during most of the early summer. The stripers will continue to migrate to the tailrace discharge the entire month of June and should be great by month end.


