



Fishing Hot Spots



Cherokee Lake: Good

Stripers will not go back well in July. Catch your limit and quit. Released fish will not survive for the most part. Hybrids are more tolerant of the warm water and can often be caught in schools in shallow water. They can also be released normally without mortality. The no fishing zone is in effect again starting July 15. The humps and islands near the dam up to Point #21 normally become excellent.

Norris Lake: Fair

Point #26 on the Clinch and Point #14 on the Powell to the dam. Most of the stripers will move into the main channel out of the shallow warm coves. Down lines and downriggers work well over marked fish.

Fort Loudon & Melton Hill Tailraces: Good & Improving

The law is you must wear your life jacket in these dangerous waters. Put your sinker and hook close to the bottom with plans to lose a few for the most catches. Pulling side planer boards down the banks can also catch fish for miles downstream.

July Expectations

The migration downstream toward the dam has started in the reservoirs. The stripers will be a little easier to locate as the temperature in the coves and creeks pushes them into the deeper, cooler main channel. The thermocline will continue to get deeper with the fish staying just below it, and surface feeding in the reservoirs is over until October. A good topographical map now becomes a great fishing tool. The tailraces will continue to improve. They will be a good place to find some action while also still allowing successful catch and release in the hot summer. Working the "boils" will become very effective in July. It is your life and money, so remember to wear your life jacket at the dams. It is the law also.

HELP STOP POACHING 800-255-8972

Poachers that use illegal commercial gear or fishing tools to kill fish are stealing from you and me. There are also some criminals that fail to use the guidelines set by our wildlife and fish management experts. They should be reported for violations of creel and size limits. We should be critical of any violations on our wonderful striped bass and try to get the violators caught. On the other extreme of take anything you can get are conservation extremists like the spotted owl tree huggers, P.E.T.A., and snail darter protectors. My suggestion is each person stays within their legal limits of the law and not be so quick to criticize someone else that is also within their limits of the law. The wildlife and fish management experts do hear our concerns and request to change some of the laws as needed (CHEROKEE NO FISH ZONE) (NORRIS SEASONAL AND TEMPORARY SIZE LIMITS). Be conservation minded, chill-out, and enjoy the fishing trip.

Minutes of the May Meeting

Bob Leach went over the Cherokee Tournament details.

We discussed the upcoming Cumberland River Trip and the upcoming Kids' Day. I informed everyone that we would not be sponsoring a campout but instead would try to have a cookout or something after the fishing is over the morning of June 19.

May 21-22 Cherokee Tournament

One of the disappointments of our 2005 tournaments has been that not enough members have been catching stripers during our events. I realize that the mark of a successful outing is to have fun and not whether or not you actually catch fish, but I think that everyone would have a better time if the success ratio was higher. Therefore, we are going to experiment with some different ideas to try get more fish weighed in. The following changes were implemented for the May 21-22 tournament.

Two-day Tournament - This tournament was held on Saturday night and the following Sunday morning. You could fish either or both days and weigh in the largest fish you caught on those two days. Only the largest fish per angler counted for the prize money. The \$11 entry fee covered both days.

Launch Site - The official launch site was the boat ramp just South of the Cherokee Dam, and I was there at pre-established times to register members and guests. Once you paid your entry fee, you were free to launch at any boat ramp on Cherokee. Also, if you prepaid before the event, you could go straight to the launch site of your choice, and you did not have to show up at the Cherokee Dam boat ramp. We did specify the earliest time that you could put any lines in the water. This allowed anglers to leisurely go to their chosen fishing spot and be ready when the "Lines-in-the -Water" time arrived.

Tournament Results - A total of 24 members registered for the tournament and 10 anglers weighed in fish. The top four winners are as follows: Ted Karagias - 17/02; Allan Franklin - 16/09; Jonathan Franklin - 15/05; and Gayle Karagias - 15/01. Most of the members appeared to like the format for the tournament as the catch ratio was up considerably from the past, and it allowed members more flexibility in scheduling their weekend as you could fish either Saturday, Sunday or both days. We will consider ways to refine the rules to make them even more fun for everyone. You should definitely try to participate in some of our friendly tournaments as it is a lot of fun.



Letter from the Vice President

Rivers

In the local area there are a number of cold-water rivers that hold stripers. These fish can be caught and released long after the lake temperatures get too hot to put fish back. Slow trolling along a river is my favorite way to fish for Stripers. There is always something to do, and the scenery is constantly changing even when the fish don't bite. It takes a shallow draft boat, planer boards, and live bait. When a big Striper hits in cold running water, you will know something happened. Parts of the Tennessee, Little Tennessee, Tellico, Emory, Holston, French Broad, Clinch, Powell, Emory, Hiwassee, Ocoee, Cumberland, Obed, Watauga, and Caney Fork Rivers are all places you might find a few Stripers this Summer. I haven't fished them all yet, but I am working on it. Do your homework before you go. Get good maps and know what conditions to expect. Be aware of water release schedules for upstream dams. GPS mapping is a good idea as is NOAA weather radio. Keep an eye out for shoals, rocks, snags and other hard objects and be aware that the lay of the river is ever changing and hard objects tend to relocate between trips. So pick a river and go.
