

There are several things that may be of interest to you, such as the pictures page, fishing reports, live weather info, fishing articles, and the TSBA events calendar.


Just to take a quick look at some of the above mentioned,

Tournament Trail

The 2005 Tournament Trail continued over the weekend of July 9 with our fifth tournament of the year. We implemented some new ideas for this tournament to see how well they would be received. First of all, we made this a New-Buddy tournament where we added weight to your catch if you fished with someone who had never been in your boat before. Also, we counted both your top striper and hybrid. Finally, this tournament was "By the Boat" so that all anglers in the boat got credit for the catch regardless of who actually landed the fish. Unfortunately, the weather was very hot which limited the turnout. The top three stripers were: 18/12 caught by Reid Tong and Mark McComber; 16/03 caught by Bill Cate, Janine and Dave Johnson and 13/00 caught by Allan Franklin and Daryl McDaniel. Allan's boat was the only one that landed a hybrid which weighed-in at 7/09.

The top three members in the overall standings are Allan Franklin at 47/03; Bill Cate at 34/10, and Janine Johnson at 32/01. The final tournament will be below Melton Hill Dam on Saturday, August 20. It will be quite difficult for anyone to overtake Allan's huge lead, but anything is possible.

To date a total of 56 different anglers have participated in at least one TSBA tournament this year which isn't too bad. Next year, we will make some changes to assure that the race is much tighter and more exciting. We will definitely have at least one New-Buddy tournament as that was well received. The primary objective is to have fun and to meet new people. I know that I have personally enjoyed all of the tournaments even if I don't catch anything.

Please make every effort to join us below Melton Hill Dam on August 20th as we will have a good time. The details of the tournament will be posted on the website just before the event. We will start at first light if they are not releasing any water at that time and weigh-in around 10:00 AM.












Fishing Hot Spots



Cherokee Lake: Poor

The best fishing will be within a few miles of the dam. Pulling artificials on downriggers and jigging spoons will catch more fish than live bait this month. Most of the time, hybrids can be released. Please do not kill more than your limit of stripers after September 15 in the oxygen bubbles by trying to release them.

Norris Lake: Good

Most of the stripers will be near the dam. Point #9 downstream and in Big Creek and Cove Creek. Artificial bait on downriggers works great. Nighttime still offers a lot of good fishing.

To review the dissolved oxygen level data, go to www.TNStripedBass.com. Click on "TWRA Region 4." Then click on "Water Quality."

Tailrace and Downstream: Excellent

Four common methods of fishing below dams all work well.

1. Run up into the boils and lob live bait into the boil and drift downstream. 2. Cast heavy jigs into the boils or cast into schooling fish anywhere you find them. 3. Use side planer boards against the bank with live bait going with the current for miles downstream. 4. Fish with live bait and a heavy sinker placed near the bottom and go with the current until you find feeding fish.

September Expectations

Early September is much the same as August in the reservoirs. The larger stripers will be in the old river channels near the dam, below the thermocline, trying to find enough cool water with dissolved oxygen in it to survive. The stripers are stressed more than any other time of year so catch and release is not possible if it exceeds 20 to 25 inches (4 to 8 pounds) depending on the reservoir. As the cold water is released through the dam, the funnel effect can cause the thermocline to go very deep late in the month so fish can be caught in excess of 100 feet. Cool water tailrace fishing will continue to be at its best for the entire year. Some of the tailraces may struggle to have a successful catch and release of the larger fish. Wear your life jacket below the dams. It may save you \$200 in fines or even your life.

Commercial fishing is trying to open Cherokee Lake, Norris Lake, and Watts Bar Lake to gill netting. TSBA is opposed to it, and members will be attending the commission meeting in Nashville on July 20.

There is good fishing this time of year below Fort Loudoun Dam and Melton Hill Dam. The no fish zone at Cherokee Lake is in effect between July 15 and September 15. Do not release fish on Norris or Cherokee. They will not survive. Catch your limit and go home.

Open fishing days, Cumberland River Trip, and tournaments were discussed. Details of events will be placed on the website Calendar.

The Annual TSBA Fish Fry & Reunion is scheduled for September 10, 2005 at 2:00 p.m. at Anderson County Park. There will be cast net lessons, contests, and prizes.

Kids & Fishing

The sport of striper fishing is especially important to almost all of the members of our club or we probably wouldn't be in the TSBA. On many occasions, we have talked about how important kids are to the future of striper and all types of fishing. I was reading a copy of the July 12th USA Today and an article on the habits of today's kids caught my eye. The title of the article was "Childhood pastimes are increasingly moving indoors". As I think most of us know, being a kid isn't what it used to be. When I was growing up in a small town in Indiana, my friends and I were almost always outdoors. During the summer, you were, home only to eat and sleep. Now, you have to push most kids out the door so that they can get some exercise. Today, childhood is spent mostly indoors, watching television, playing video games, and surfing the Internet. fundamental nature of American childhood has changed in a single generation. The unstructured outdoor childhood - days of fishing, baseball, basketball, exploring, bicycling, treehouses, and "be home for dinner" has all but vanished. Here are some startling statistics that USA Today presented in the article comparing the decline in outdoor activities from 1995 to 2004. The numbers represent the percentage of 7 to 11 year-old kids taking part in traditional pastime activities:

Activity	1995	2004
Bicycling	68%	47%
Swimming	60%	42%
Baseball	29%	22%
Fishing	25%	18%

The drop from 25% to 18% for fishing represents a 28% decline in a period of less than 10 years. This is something that we should all ponder on and not just for fishing. Evidently, it's more fun to play a video game than to go outside and fish.


