Minutes of the August Meeting

John opened the meeting and turned it over to Jim Negus. Jim started the meeting off with possession limit rules and explained them and how they were used to enforce serious exploitation. A short explanation is you are only allowed a single limit in possession while in the field. Houseboats, campers, and home freezers are only allowed a 2-day possession limit at one time. Bring a limit in the morning and go back to bring another limit in the same day is illegal. Water quality was the subject of the rest of the meeting. Methods for keeping bait alive and healthy were discussed. Regulating water temperature in the tank without chlorine in the ice, the correct amount of salt added per gallon of water, tranguilizers to calm the bait, filter and change of some of the water to reduce ammonia were talked about. TVA and TWRA have done studies and kept records on the reservoirs since 1990 in the summer months. The records include dissolved oxygen, temperature, secchi, P.H., conductivity, and chlorophyll at depth to 100 feet. Summer stratification of the reservoirs into layers and the thermocline influence on bait fish and the striper were discussed. After the break, drawing for door prizes and the 50-50 drawing were done with Kyle Rutherford winning the 50-50. A reminder and plans for the September 29th fish fry were discussed. starts at 2 p.m. Allan Franklin will give lessons and do the cast net contest with a cast net for the 1st place prize. Cash prizes will be awarded for a plug casting contest. There will be a ladies and kids cast net contest if enough interest is shown. Fishing reports for below the dams was poor for the time of year. Allan Franklin suggested pulling planer boards down the river and, when you find a striper interested in your bait, put bait on and lob or toss it into the location the striper was holding. Norris was the only other report. considered good, but the fish were roaming and not staying in the same locations as is normal for this time of year.

Fishing Hot Spots



Cherokee Lake: Fair

Early October will have some stripers that have not left the aeration near the dam. The best fishing will be from Point #14 upstream to Point #26. Baitfish on the surface will have some striper breaks at the right time of day. It is not uncommon to catch stripers to 20 pounds and hybrids to 10 pounds.

Norris Lake: Fair

The stripers have scattered, and if you find them, the bite can be good on some days. The best fishing is from the forks of the river (Point #9) upstream about 10 miles (Point #24 on the Clinch and Point #14 on the Powell). The water quality was better than normal this summer, although the drought caused the lake drawdown to be early.

Tailrace and Downstream: Excellent

It is hard to fish wrong here with the bait and hungry fish plentiful.

October Expectations

Lake turnover takes place through the month of October in the reservoirs of Tennessee. As the lake is homogenized, stripers will be free to roam the waters top to bottom, bank to bank, and end to end. This sometimes makes stripers difficult to locate because you have to find them on a daily basis. Many times the best clue is to find the largest baitfish concentrations. October is also the start of some surface feeding. Catch and release also becomes an option again. The tailrace fishing and the river-run below them will still be at a premium as the reservoirs are being emptied to their winter levels. The scenery is wonderful on the water this month. The lack of storms, heat, humidity, ski boats, and jet skis is welcome.



CHANGE OF SEASON IN EAST TENNESSEE

Here in East Tennessee we have some of the best all year long striper fishing available anywhere. reservoirs that have stripers and hybrid striped bass with good catch rates all year long. Tailrace and river run fisheries can be accessed and fished in cool water all summer long. A few cold river fisheries are around that hold a few very large stripers all summer if you have a skinny (shallow) water boat to get to them. Stripers that exceed 7 or 8 pounds must find water temperature less than 80 degrees to keep from stressing out and stop eating. From a perfect 57 degrees the stripers are very comfortable 10 degrees either cooler or warmer and can run above the thermocline into hotter water for a short burst to feed. A few other factors like dissolved oxygen, length of stressful time, and current also come into play. Large stripers will actually stay in cool water with not enough oxygen to sustain life when good oxygen is only a few yards up in the water column but above the temperature they desire. When looking for stripers to fish for in the summer, it is a good idea to find the coolest water that holds stripers. Catch and release practices are questionable for 10 pound plus fish when the water temperature is above 80 degrees.

After talking about all this hot weather and water stuff it is time to change the season to fall. YES, YES, YES, I am ready - no more BIG pleasure boats, ski boats, jet skis, with all the kids back in school and the fishermen / hunters mostly off the water. Although it makes the stripers a little harder to locate on a daily basis, the enjoyment is so much greater. The harvest season is a wonderful time of year until about December. The days are comfortable with cool mornings and nights. stripers can go anywhere in the system they want to go. Of course, they can find comfortable water temperature anywhere and will go to where the bait fish are the most abundant. Top water action is not uncommon as early as late September or early October in the reservoirs. Bait becomes very easy to catch and keep for the next day's trip. The gulls and other fish eating birds return to show you where to fish through the cold months of the year. The birds make a living at it so the stripers will be feeding on the same bait as the birds. The rivers and tailraces will still have some stripers but will change some of their habits the colder the water temperature gets. Sometime in December, the warm water discharges at the steam plants begin to hold enough bait to attract big game fish. Catch and release of the stripers will almost always be successful this time of year.
