More About The Drought

Last month I wrote a little article for the newsletter discussing the ongoing drought in East Tennessee. As a follow up to that article, I've taken a couple of pictures which visually indicate how serious the conditions have become. The first picture was taken from the picnic area in the TVA park next to the boat launch just south of Cherokee Dam. It shows just how far the water has dropped. Also, please note that the swimming area is completely dry. The yellow line in the picture is the floating boundary separating the swimming area from the rest of the lake. The only problem now is that it's not floating. Most of the buoys marking the "No Boats" zone are high and dry.

The second picture was taken from the north shore of Cherokee Lake just north of the dam near the primitive boat launch. Most members probably are unaware of this launch which is good as it's not a very good place to launch your boat. The dead tree in the upper left-hand part of this picture is what I normally call the "Lone Tree Island." It's the first island you encounter on the left-hand side of the lake after you pass the dam going upstream. When the lake is full, all you see of this island is the tree as everything else is under water. The problem now is that it's no longer an island. Instead it's a very large peninsula. To give you a better perspective of its size, I parked my truck over 400' from the lone tree, and I could have parked it another 300' from the tree if the sand was more solid.

Even the old-timers who have fished Cherokee for many years have never seen the lake this low in mid-October, and it's going to get worse before it gets better. This is the normal dry season for East Tennessee, so things probably won't improve for a couple of months. Let's all hope for a very wet winter and spring so all of the East Tennessee lakes and reservoirs will get back to normal next year.

Fishing Hot Spots



Cherokee Lake: Good

Early and late day often have breaking fish, so keep something to cast handy. December is the time to look for gulls. Look for large concentrations of bait fish because the stripers will come to them. Normally, the best fishing is around mid lake (Points 10 to 20). Bait is easy to catch in all the large coves.

Norris Lake: Good

The fish are not as big as past years but are growing and seem to be healthy. The best fishing will be near Hickory Star to Straight Creek Marina (Points 22 to 29 on the Clinch side and Points 12 to 16 on the Powell side).

Remember to check the fishing regulations on Norris starting November 1 because it is your responsibility to stay legal on quantity and size harvested (1 fish, 36 inches). Look around mid lake and in the large coves.

Tailrace and Downstream: Fair

As the weather cools, the steam plants will become more productive.

December Expectations

The thermocline is gone and the temperature is near the same from top to bottom. Expect to find the temperature in the mid 40's unless influenced by springs or steam plants. The bait fish will be in the warmest water they can find; the stripers will be close by. Large baits work well the first half of December, but as the temperature drops, smaller baits are best. Top water baits are normally good the first half of the month. Stripers often push the bait fish to the surface, and gulls become more productive as the month progresses and the temperature begins to drop. Point or bottom fishing is normally effective. Before going fishing, we ask that you take every precaution to prevent hypothermia. Catch and release works great in the winter months.

Minutes of the October Meeting

Bill Ballou started the meeting with the basics of amateur rod building for your own personal satisfaction. Websites to obtain the materials he uses were (mudhole) and (customrodbuilding). Bill demonstrated how to choose a fast, medium, or slow action rod blank and install the rod seat, handle, eyes and tip. Bill also showed how to replace broken and bent eyes and tips on your old rods to keep from buying new ones. Interesting questions and answers followed.

Chet did the door prize drawing of some excellent gifts. Bill Ballou won the 50 / 50 drawing.

New member Bill Clay started the fishing reports by telling of some funny incidents on his first striper trips with Tom Elmore on Norris. Fishing reports on Norris were excellent on the lower end near the dam. The fish are still 50 feet and deeper which makes them very hard to release alive. The lake turnover should start soon and allow the stripers to be released alive and roam all over lake. There was a reminder on Norris about the 1 fish 36 inch size limit going into effect on November 1. Erik Engebretsen gave a report of fishing on Cherokee with minimal success on hybrids in shallow water above the 25E bridge. Chet Moore said the fishing below Melton Hill was good with some good size and they were going back well. He also said they were breaking in the early a.m. Yellowtails are easy up near the dam before generation. Allan Franklin and Bill Ballou had similar reports from there.

Nominations were opened until the November meeting for two of the director's spots that are coming open for three-year terms. The three currently nominated are Ezell Cox, Allan Franklin, and Erik Engebretsen. The new president of the club will automatically become a director during the one-year term of office.

Nominations for other offices are: For President - Eric Rauch For Vice President - Jim Blazer For Secretary - Ezell Cox For Treasurer - Janine Johnson

There was a request for input for topics of the month and articles for the newsletters, someone to coordinate sponsor donations to the club for next year, and help with obtaining speakers for next year. Allan Franklin reported a fish kill on the lower end of Cherokee of about 150 to 200 stripers, and added a reminder about not being caught with a striper that falls in the slot limit on Melton Hill.
