MINUTES OF THE NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER MEETINGS

The Tennessee Striped Bass Association, Inc. met at the Clinton Shoney's (I-75 exit 122) at 7:00 pm on November 16, 2009. There were the usual order-what-you want dinner and discussions from around 6:00 to 7:00pm. There were 17 people in attendance.

There was no formal speaker for this meeting. There was a general discussion of winter fishing methods. There was a great degree of consensus considering that most people there don't agree on much of anything. The general feeling was in cold water conditions:

1.Slow down

2. Watch for gulls and signs of surface feeding

3.Pull u-rigs to find fish in feeding areas. If they are hitting them keep it up.

4.Don't just pull in a straight line. Turning will speed and raise one side and slow and lower the other side.

5. If you are over fish try downlines moving slowly and possibly with smaller bait than in warmer water

6.Stop and just let bait sit either below a bait school or just in it

In December there is no formal Club meeting. The Board of Directors meet to discuss the past year, plan the upcoming year and discuss general club business. Anyone is welcome to come and participate.


The meeting was Chaired by Erik Engebretsen.

Club Treasurer Doug Steffe reported on the club finances. The period of 9/24/2008 thru 10/17/2009 the Club had received \$6484.00, spent \$4896.77 and had a remaining balance of \$1587.23. This is combined with a carryover balance from 2008 to total \$4356.00.

The Club has 187 family Memberships, 8 Sponsors, 11 Honor Members, and e-mails 69 of the Newsletters.

Doug Steffe suggested that some of the money be used to buy a projector for around \$400 that could interface with a computer for use at Club meetings and also a small laptop computer for about the same price for use with the Club records. A motion was made, seconded and approved to authorize Doug to get costs and make a purchase recommendation at the January meeting.

The Vest tank was the clear leader in 2007 but in 2009 the Creek Bank tank has moved from last choice to first choice. I also noted that in 2007 no one reported using a Masterflow tank but in 2009 3 members reported that this is the tank they are currently using. I am not trying to promote any of these tanks but based our member responses Creek Bank must be making a very good product. I have observed over the past few years that our club members tend to be very "brand loyal" and are willing to voice their opinions about the equipment they use very strongly. If the tank of choice has changed so strongly in two years there must be some very good reasons. I don't have a Creek Bank or Vest tank. I currently have a Blue Water tank because it was the best fit for the limited space in my boat but if I decided to buy a new tank I would talk to club members and ask to see their tanks before making my next purchase.

Tank size: Our members reported using many different size tanks but three sizes were listed as the most popular 30 gal. (8 ea.), 40 gal. (5 ea.) and 60 gal. (6 ea.).

Fishing Hot Spots



Cherokee Lake

Condition: Good

Location: Spread out all over with a good number of fish near Hwy 25 Bridge. Fish are hitting top water baits. Birds are diving on the schools of shad driven up by the stripers.

Bait: Live Shad and Top Water

Norris Lake

Condition: Slow

Location: Stripers may be found farther upstream in the creeks. Use alewife and gizzard shad near the surface on drift lines or downriggers to 30 feet. Cast artificials into the breaking fish.

Notes: Fish are going back and there is some top water action. Bait, as always, is impossible to catch. Bring bait with you.

Watts Bar Lake

Condition: Fair

Notes: Fish near the Kingston Steam Plant in the warmer water. Remember to keep your boat within the buoys where designated in the Fishing Regulations.

Melton Hill Lake

Condition: Fair

Location: Bull Run Steam plant or the Upper Clinch is the place to try with gizzard shad and cut-bait. Top water baits are definitely an option.

FEBRUARY EXPECTATIONS

Wintertime patterns are expected in all reservoirs as long as the temperature remains well below 50 degrees. Slow catch rates will be on the mid lake and downstream sections. Winter kill off of small bait fish may start to develop as soon as the water temperature drops. The stripers and gulls may occasionally work the surface together. Normally the best fishing is near the large concentration of small baitfish in the main channels, 20 to 40 feet deep. The next few months is when the records have been and will be broken. The steam plants are the premium places to fish until the water warms up in the spring. Skipjack have been the choice bait for most of the past records and trophies; however, the most abundant forage fish will catch the most fish even if they are smaller bait. Planer boards, balloons, sinkers, bottom fishing and artificials all work at the steam plants while the high concentrations of baitfish and all types of game fish are there.

Grainger County Park

As most of you probably know, the TSBA held all of its 2009 outdoor events at the Grainger County Park which is located on the northwest shore of Cherokee lake upstream from the dam. This facility was chosen for the Kid's day, the StriperBowl and the September fish fry due to its location and excellent facilities.

Evidently, this park is quite popular as, in late 2009, they started construction on a second large pavilion which should be done shortly. This pavilion is located between the boat ramp parking lot and the kid's play area as shown in the photo below. One nice feature of this new pavilion is that it has attached restroom facilities. The picnic-table area under the roof is not quite as long as the other pavilion but it's at least 50% wider so it could easily accommodate three rows of picnic tables.
