Each TSBA member that has registered on our website can vote on this poll. Please vote and share your opinion with the entire club. This is a secret vote, every registered member can only vote once but can change his or her vote if they chose in the future. As of 10/21/09 the vote was Saturday (4) and Sunday (1).

I will make a couple of suggestions for the membership to consider.

#1 If we had at least two people volunteer to be photographers this would enable them to capture pictures from different angles. One of the nice things I have learned about using digital cameras is that I might take 100 pictures and only keep the best 20-40,or less some times. It is nice to not have to be selective like we used to do with film cameras so shoot a lot of pictures and be selective after you shoot a bunch.

Minutes of the October Meeting

The Tennessee Striped Bass Association, Inc. met at the Clinton Shoney's (I-75 exit 122) at 7:00 pm on October,19, 2009. There were the usual order-what-you want dinner and discussions from around 6:00 to 7:00pm. There were 21 people in attendance.

Bob Leach told us that Granger County Park where we had this years Fish Fry was building a new pavilion. It appears to be about 50% larger and will have restrooms. It looks like we will have a nice location for next years Fish Fry.

The discussion for the meeting was presented by Ezell Cox. He announced that the TWRA had reconsidered their position on stocking stripers in Cherokee Lake and will be putting some in for at least the next several years. Historically TWRA has put around 75,000 hybrids and 75,000 stripers into Cherokee. For 2008 and 2009, they put in 85,000 hybrids each year and no stripers. The logic was that hybrids did much better in the lake than stripers and they were going to let it become a hybrid only lake. There was considerable objection to that plan. Some of it based on emotion, some on the fear that it would increase the fishing pressure on the remaining lakes with a good striper population and some on the desire to be have at least the possibility of catching a good striper on Cherokee. The TWRA has considered our concerns and has modified their policy. For 2010 they will stock 150,000 hybrids and 20,000 stripers with the possibility of adding an additional 25,000 hybrids if they are available.

There was then a general discussion period covering tips and hints led by Ezell . Here are some of the points covered:

- It is about the time of year to watch for gulls feeding in groups on the surface. As the water cools in the fall, bait fish move from the cooling shallow water to more open water. Schools of stripers will push them to the surface to feed and that attracts flocks of feeding gulls. It is a good time for u-rigs under flocks of diving gulls.
- If you are fishing downlines or pulling boards put out one line with 17 pulls of line (about 35 ft) and 3 split shot. It works.
- If you are over a nonrocky bottom and there are fish on the bottom that won't hit, put on a barrel sinker and bait, let it drop to the bottom and rip it up as high as you can left.
- If you are over fish that won't hit, try chumming. Take some shad, let them die and or almost die and dump them in. It can sometimes start an immediate and widespread feeding frenzy.

October is the month we nominate the new members for the Board of Directors and Club officers for the upcoming year. There will be 3 opening positions on the Board and the nominees were:

This slate of Directors and Officers will be voted on at the November meeting

For the November meeting we would like to have an open general discussion of how you plan to fish for the rest of the year and early next year. (Where, how, with what). Bring things for show and tell if you want and let's see if we can all help each other have a great end of the year and learn and try a few new things. This is really the point of the club and we probably don't do something like this often enough. I have noticed in discussions before or after meetings when one person opens up a little then someone else adds something and pretty soon some valuable information gets shared. You don't have to share your number one best secret spot, but there are probable a lot of things you have done for years and think are common knowledge but to someone else it would be new.

Fishing Hot Spots



Cherokee Lake: Good

Early and late day often have breaking fish, so keep something to cast handy. December is the time to look for gulls. Look for large concentrations of bait fish because the stripers will come to them. Normally, the best fishing is around mid lake (Points 10 to 20). Bait is easy to catch in all the large coves.

Norris Lake: Good

The fish are not as big as past years but are growing and seem to be healthy. The best fishing will be near Hickory Star to Straight Creek Marina (Points 22 to 29 on the Clinch side and Points 12 to 16 on the Powell side). Remember to check the fishing regulations on Norris starting November 1 because it is your responsibility to stay legal on quantity and size harvested (1 fish, 36 inches). Look around mid lake and in the large coves.

Tailrace and Downstream: Fair

As the weather cools, the steam plants will become more productive.

<u>Creel Limit Changes:</u> Effective 11/1 thru 3/31 the limit is one fish up to 36 inches on Norris, Boone and Watts Bar.

DECEMBER EXPECTATIONS

The thermocline is gone and the temperature is near the same from top to bottom. Expect to find the temperature in the mid 40's unless influenced by springs or steam plants. The bait fish will be in the warmest water they can find; the stripers will be close by. Large baits work well the first half of December, but as the temperature drops, smaller baits are best. Top water baits are normally good the first half of the month. Stripers often push the bait fish to the surface, and gulls become more productive as the month progresses and the temperature begins to drop. Point or bottom fishing is normally effective. Before going fishing, we ask that you take every precaution to prevent hypothermia. Catch and release works great in the winter months.

Remember umbrella rigs when you find concentrations of gulls.




