FAIR WEATHER FISHERMAN

OK I admit it; I am a fair weather fisherman. I used to go fishing almost every weekend but that was before I had 4-5 weeks vacation and could even take vacation in four-hour increments. But now that I am retired I can really pick my times and weather conditions. Winter is not my favorite time of year. If I didn't have family commitments I would probably spend January and February in Florida, or maybe even farther south. A recent trip with our travel friends Jimmy and Pat Welch reinforced this opinion.

Debbie and I had the pleasure of spending several days in central Florida with the Welch family and their friends. Jimmy told me his friend Larry was an avid fisherman and would "put us on the fish". Larry did say that he could not take us to the lake where we could catch the 2# crappie due to wind conditions. But we would go to a phosphate pit that had been reclaimed as a state park. Sand mounds and trees that would shelter us from the wind surrounded this lake.

Larry said he would pick us up at the motel at 5 a.m. and treat us to breakfast. He was there on time and told us the biscuits were already cooked and waiting for us. It was a short trip to his house and the smell of homemade biscuits was enough to wake us up even before we started on the coffee. Larry got busy and cooked the sausage, eggs and gravy as well as any short order cook. This fishing trip was definitely starting off well even if I did have to wake up so early.

Larry had the rods set up with a bell sinker on the bottom and two small gold hooks spaced about 8-10" apart above the sinker. I thought the minnows we were using were too small until the crappie started biting.

I got to listen to several fishing and hunting stories during the day and enjoy some great fellowship. I did learn a new fishing term, at least new to me, that I will share. Larry told me to check my hooks frequently to make sure that I "was not fishing on credit" which meant an empty hook. He said there were a lot of critters in this water that would steal your bait. We also saw a small gator in the weeds while we were fishing. Larry said the big gators would not be a problem until the water got warmer.

But one thing most of the locals were very cautious about was the buzzards. If you could not park close to the road it was a good practice to cover the truck or car with a tarp to prevent the buzzards from eating wiper blades and window gaskets. They were crazy about rubber products!!!

We caught a bunch of good crappie and most of them were a little over a pound. It would have been nice to catch some of those two-pound crappie but the waves were just too big on that lake. I know the typical TSBA fishing reports and pictures are about big fish but this time the fellowship was more important that the size of the fish. Jim Blazier




