CHEROKEE LAKE

NO FISHING ZONE RUNS JULY 15—SEPTEMBER 15 IN FRONT OF THE DAM. Migration back from the headwaters & major creek feeds is slow to develop because of the low water and flow this spring & summer. The stripers / hybrids continue moving downstream to the lower end of Cherokee until mid Sept. Look for large concentrations of bait fish, cormorants, & herons. Catch and release will continue to be less and less successful for striper / hybrid, so go prepared to keep them with ice and stop fishing. Pictures and weight for harvested fish only because every second out of the water is a death sentence.

Creel and Size Limits

CHEROKEE LAKE

<u>Striped Bass or Hybrid Striped Bass:</u> 2 per day in combination, 15 inch minimum length limit

NORRIS LAKE

Striped Bass

April 1-October 31: 2 per day, 15 inch minimum length limit

November 1-March 31:1 per day, 36 inch minimum length limit

WATTS BAR

Striped Bass or Hybrid Striped Bass:

April 1–October 31: 2 per day in combination

November 1–March 31: 2 per day in combination, only one may be a striped bass.

Striped Bass:

April 1–October 31:15 inch minimum length limit. November 1– March 31:36 inch minimum length limit

Hybrid Striped Bass: 15 inch minimum length limit

MELTON HILL

<u>Striped Bass or Hybrid Striped Bass:</u> 2 per day in combination, including Clinch River upstream to Highway 61 bridge in Clinton. <u>Striped Bass:</u> 32–42 inch PLR; only one fish may be over 42 inches

Hybrid Striped Bass: 15 inch minimum length limit

Outlook for current fishing spots

CHEROKEE LAKE

The larger stripers may start to struggle from accumulated stress during this time of the year. This makes their ability to survive a catch and release experience questionable in late summer. Hybrids, however, are more tolerant of summer's warm water conditions. These fish can often be caught in schools located in shallow water then released normally without experiencing increased mortality rates. The bait-eating birds will help indicate where the striper/hybrids are going to be at the all-you-caneat buffet. The NO FISHING ZONE is in effect again starting July 15 until September 15. The humps and islands near the NO FISHING ZONE up to point #12 should be excellent.

NORRIS LAKE

The best fishing can be found around 10 miles upstream of Norris dam in the lower Clinch and Powell Rivers, including Big Creek and Cove Creek. Most of the stripers have moved out of the shallow, warm coves and into the main channel where they can be found with fish finders below the thermocline. Down lines and downriggers work well over marked fish.

WATTS BAR & MELTON HILL

Many of the stripers have moved upstream to the discharge at the dams. If you plan to fish here, remember to **WEAR YOUR LIFE JACKET**. Put your sinker and hook close to the bottom with plans to lose a few for the most catches. Pulling side planer boards down the banks can also catch fish for miles downstream. The stripers can be stressed if the flow is low enough to allow the water temperature to rise above 70 degrees. Use heavy line with a very quick release to keep from killing the fish.
